The Hunting Area:

The estate – Loch Assynt – is named after the lake Loch Assynt, which was formed by glaciers during the Ice Age. It is about ten kilometers long and a maximum of one kilometer wide. The lake's greatest depth is 86 meters. Loch Assynt is situated 66 meters above sea level.

Although the estate is located in a sparsely populated area, it is easily accessible by car. It is about a 2-hour drive from Inverness Airport. Loch Assynt is surrounded by the typical almost treeless landscape with heathercovered hills and valleys of the northern Highlands.

Red deer, sika deer, and roe deer leave their tracks in the hunting area. Various waterfowl, as well as woodcock, pheasants, black grouse, and grouse, can be encountered during the stalk.

SCOTLAND – Young and Female in the Highlands...

The Hunt:

Scotland is a country with a long hunting tradition. The focus is on sport hunting, specifically stalking. Scotland is renowned for its high density of red deer, unparalleled in Europe. Red deer hunting takes place from August to October 20th. By mid-August, at least the old stags have completely shed their velvet. Hunting is not permitted on Sundays in Scotland, so most guests arrive on this day and begin hunting on Monday morning. Hunting is only conducted by stalking, with the hinds being approached using the available cover. The stalker determines which animal will be taken. The venison weight ranges between 40 and 60 kg. After a hearty breakfast with the stalker, the usually allday stalking begins. Since the hunt takes place in extremely rugged terrain, the taken animals must be recovered with an Argo amphibious vehicle after being taken down.



Equipment:

All calibers suitable for ungulates in our region are also permitted for stag hunting in Scotland. However, anything stronger than 30-06 or 7 x 64 is viewed with suspicion. The Scots themselves shoot their red deer with relatively small calibers, as the venison is very valuable to them! It is best to travel without your own weapon and book a rental rifle onsite! Bring appropriate clothing (rain and wind protection!) so that you do not sweat while stalking. During breaks on the mountain where a constant wind blows, you should also not freeze. Bring good footwear, a lightweight binocular, and if available, a spotting scope!

Accommodation:

Accommodation is either in the old manor house with the owner of the estate or in one of the associated cottages. The scenic location and the charm of the accommodations allow one to pleasantly end an eventful hunting day.





Costs:

6 travel days (arrival Sunday – departure Friday), with 5 overnight stays with breakfast and 3 hunting days, stalking guide 2/1, all transfers within the hunting area, including hunting license and booking fee, as well as all hind culls: € 1960,- per hunter

Optional:

Half board: € 45,-/day Accompanying person Bed & Breakfast: € 110,-/day Fishing day – depending on the season – price on request

Not included:

Travel – flight via Amsterdam to Inverness, rental car for the week Rental rifle including ammunition per day: € 45,-Optional: one evening duck hunt: € 200,-/hunter

Hunting season: from October 21st to the end of February
